

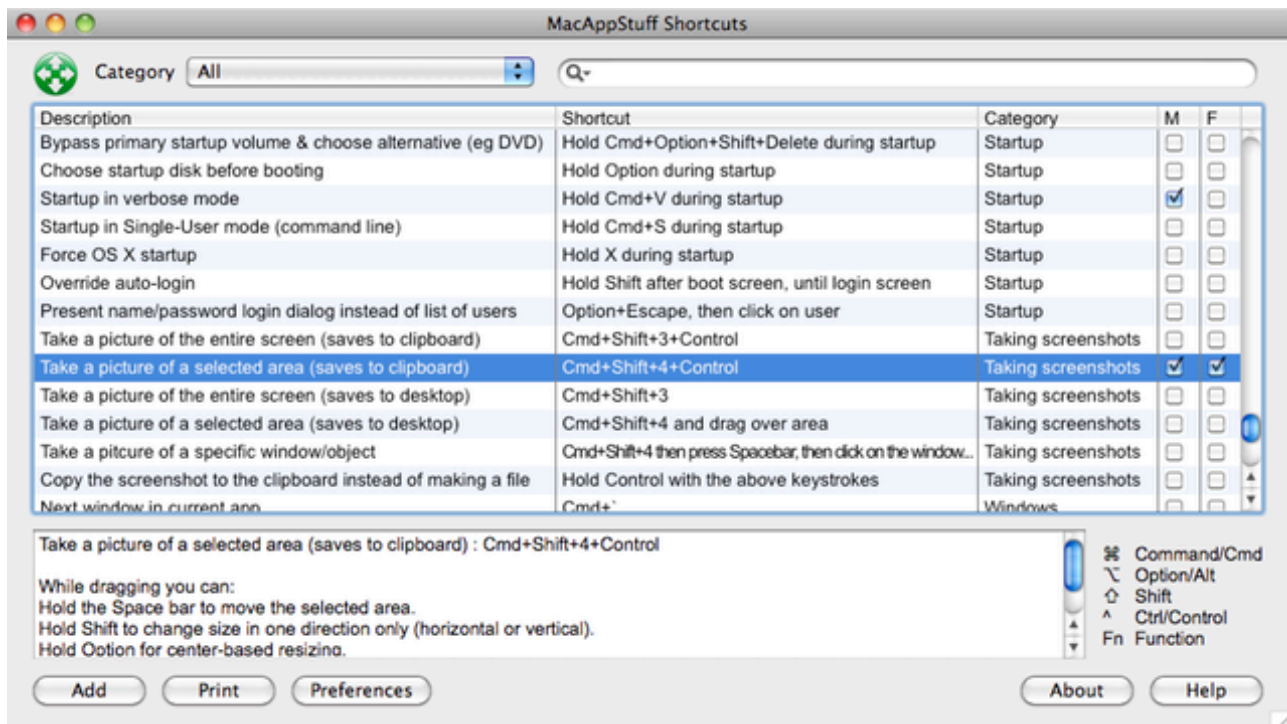

While this app will work on lower versions of OS X than 10.5, some shortcuts will only work on 10.5 and up.

Introduction

MacAppStuff Shortcuts is a reference tool for you to quickly look up handy shortcuts. The app resides in the menu bar, click on it's icon to show a menu from which you can show the app's main window or quit.

Shortcuts can be filtered using the 'Category' popup menu, or 'live' searched using the search box. You can add your own personal shortcut references too.

Shortcuts can be marked as favourites (check the box in the F column), and even added to the app's menu bar drop down menu (check the box in the M column) so you can glance quickly at the menu for a reference.

Commands

This section discusses the various button and menu commands, where applicable.

Category

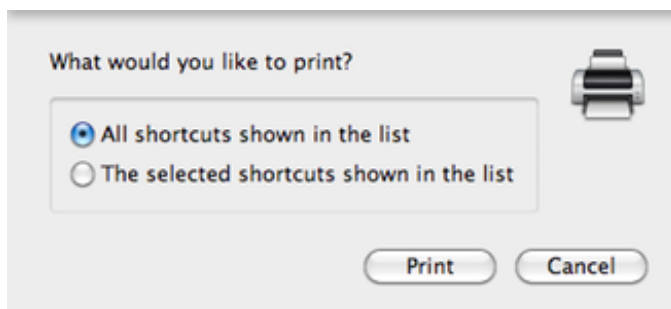
This pop-up menu acts as a filter to show only specific category shortcuts.

Add

Allows you to create your own shortcut reference. Simply fill in the fields (the Notes field is optional) and click 'Save'. Personal shortcuts are like any other, but can also be deleted from the list if you select it and right-click. This brings up a Delete menu, simply click 'Delete'.

Print

Shows the print dialog, where you choose whether to print all the shortcuts displayed in the list, or just the selected ones.



The print feature only works on items shown in the list, so if the list is filtered (only showing a particular category) and you decide to print all, only those shown in the list will be printed.

So, for example, to print ALL shortcuts filter the list by "All" and then click 'Print', then select 'All the shortcuts shown in the list' and click 'Print'.

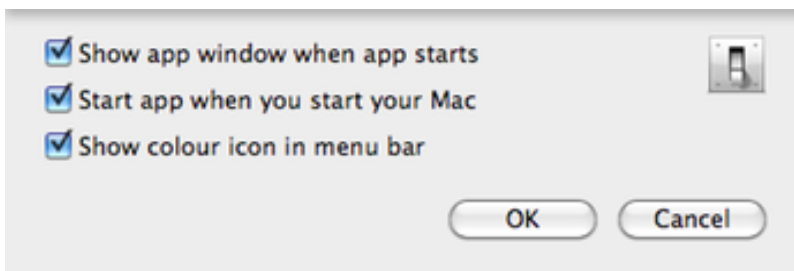
Before printing you are asked to set up the print session, you can usually just leave this and click OK. Then you are asked where to print (PDF, preview, which printer etc). Below is an example of the output:

| Quickly switch between 2 programs | Cmd-Tab | Application Switcher |
| Switch between programs with choice | Cmd-Tab (Cmd then left/right arrow keys) | Application Switcher |
| Quit an app using the application switcher | When in the app switcher holding Cmd press the app to select (arrow D) | Application Switcher |
| Hide application using application switcher | When in the app switcher holding Cmd press H when the app is selected | Application Switcher |
| Cancel out of the application switcher once it is open | When in the app switcher holding Cmd press Escape or Period (.) | Application Switcher |
| Open/close Widgets Dock | Cmd+Space/Control+Space | Desktop |
| Click to hold (simulate "drag" of widgets in Widgets Dock) | Cmd+Right/Left arrow | Desktop |

| Close a widget without having to open the Widgets Dock | Hold Option and hover mouse over widget (Close box will appear) | Desktop |

| Show Desktop | F12 | Dock |
| Force Dock | Control+Fn+F2 | Dock |
| Hide all other applications | Cmd+Option+click an app's icon in Dock | Dock |
| Move a Dock item to somewhere else on the hard drive | Cmd+click the icon in the Dock | Dock |
| Force a file to open in a specific app | Hold Cmd+Option while dragging the file onto an app's icon in the Dock | Dock |
| When in an app's Dock menu, change the Quit to Force Quit | Hold Option while in Dock menu | Dock |
| Force the Dock to only show the most important icon sets | Hold Option while dragging Dock separator | Dock |
| Move Dock to left, bottom or right side of screen | Hold Shift and drag the Dock divider | Dock |
| Temporarily turn magnification on (or off) | Hold Command+Shift | Dock |
| Go to start of line | Control+A | Emacs key bindings |
| Go to end of line | Control+E | Emacs key bindings |
| Go up one line | Control+F | Emacs key bindings |
| Go down one line | Control+B | Emacs key bindings |
| Go back one character | Control+B | Emacs key bindings |

Preferences

Displays the preferences dialog. See below.

Preferences



Show app window when app starts

When checked, the app's main window is shown whenever you start the app, otherwise it remains hidden and has to be opened via the menu bar drop down menu.

Start app when you start your Mac

When checked, the app will start whenever your Mac is turned on.

Show colour icon in menu bar

Simply allows you to toggle between a colour or black and white icon for the app in the menu bar.

Trial Limitations

The trial is designed to run for 14 days. After this time you will either need to purchase a license from our website (see below), or remove it from your computer. The trial only allows 3 shortcuts to appear in the drop down menu (menu bar), you cannot add personal shortcuts and only 'Finder' related shortcuts are displayed. The purchased version has over 280+ shortcuts.

How to buy

If you are truly satisfied with the software and have fully evaluated it for 14 days, you can purchase a license online from our website (go to the product page and click the Buy button).

PayPal handle our payments. You need a working email address to purchase the software. Once you have made your purchase, you will receive an email from PayPal confirming the transaction, and an email from us (usually within 24 - 48 hours) which will include you're your license and a download link to the software.

Your license becomes void if it is used by someone else to activate the software, if a refund is issued or your payment is fraudulent.
